

Admission into various PG Programmes under Assam Agricultural University, 2024-25

Degrees offered:

MSc (Agri) in 18 Disciplines M Tech (Agri Engg) in Soil & Water Conservation Engineering M Tech (Food Tech) in Processing Technology MSc in MBB MBA (Agri-business) MVSc in 18 Disciplines MFSc in 4 Disciplines MSc (Community Science) in 5 Disciplines PhDs (13 in Agri + 18 in Veterinary Science + 4 in Fisheries Science + 5 in Community Science) = 40

Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility criteria for admission into various PG degree programmes of the University are clearly indicated in the Information Bulletin and the Academic Regulations in force

Application

Applications are to be submitted online within the prescribed cut-off date at www.aau.ac.in

Procedure

- a) Admission into all PG Programmes (**Both Master's and PhD**) at AAU is based on the Merit list drawn from the All India Entrance Examination in Agriculture (AIEEA) conducted by the ICAR except for those disciplines for which no tests are conducted by it (*e.g.* **THT**).
- b) There will be another channel of admission, more particularly for the Master's programme in the Faculty of Agriculture and the Faculty of Veterinary Science through the conduct of a Common Entrance Test (CET-PG). The Merit List based on the CET-PG shall apply only when AIEEA-qualified candidates do not find a place in their desired subject-group, subject to the availability of vacant slots. This will allow the interested students to pursue their higher studies in related disciplines on one hand, and at the same time the vacant seats, if any, can be well taken care of, on the other.
- c) In the event of the non-availability of eligible candidates in a particular category/quota, the assigned seta for that category shall be converted to the unreserved category only in the last round of counselling.
- d) In-service candidates fulfilling the requirements as per the Information Bulletin 2024 shall have an opportunity to get admitted against an unreserved seat in a Discipline (Maximum one in a discipline)
- e) As a special arrangement, admission into **MSc (Community Science) in FSN programme** shall be **based on an Entrance Test** to be conducted by the University, without any reference to All-India score, to accommodate FND graduates as well, this year (2024-25).
- f) There will be **separate Entrance Tests** at the Departmental level for the subject groups with inconsistent eligibility criteria (*e.g.* **ABT/BAC/FST/MBA**)
- g) The candidates are required to clear the relevant Test(s) to get an entry into the respective disciplines.
- h) International students are exempted from appearing in the Entrance Test
