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




By linking these practices to the structural integrity and functional performance of the silk fabric, the training underscores the role of sustainable innovation in reducing environmental impact while meeting the global demand for eco-friendly textiles. Additionally, it highlights current trends and scientific advancements in sericulture and silk fabric, aiming to align production processes with international sustainability standards.
